

RECYCLING



Recycling is the procedure that people convert in materials into new materials. This concept often includes the generation of energy from waste materials. The recyclability of a material depends on its ability to reacquire the properties it had in its original state. It is an alternative to conventional waste disposal that can save material and help lower greenhouse gas emissions. It can also prevent the waste of potentially useful materials and reduce the consumption of fresh raw materials, reducing energy use, air pollution from incineration and water pollution from landfilling.

Recycling is a key component of modern waste reduction and is the third component of the Reduce, Reuse, and Recycle waste hierarchy. It promotes environmental sustainability by removing raw material input and redirecting waste output in the economic system. There are some ISO standards related to recycling, such as ISO 15270:2008 for plastic waste and ISO 14001:2015 for environmental management control of recycling practice.

Recyclable materials include many kinds of glass, paper, cardboard, metal, plastic, tires, textiles, batteries and electronics. The composting and other reuse of biodegradable waste such as food and garden waste is also a form of recycling. Materials for recycling are either delivered to a household recycling center or picked up from curbside bins, then sorted, cleaned, and reprocessed into new materials for

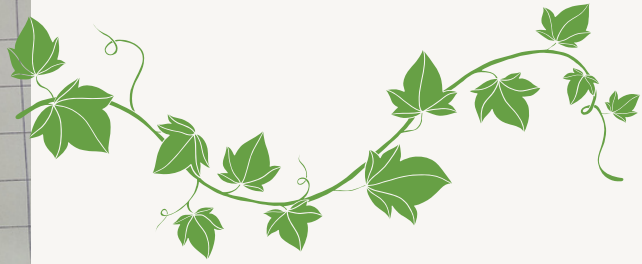
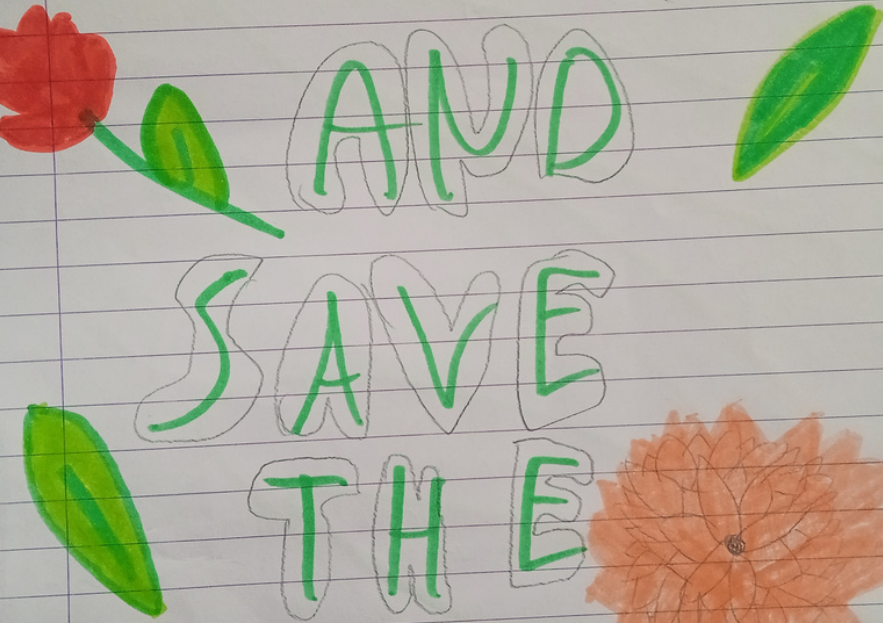

WOMEN IN PAKISTAN

Although it is a powerful state and occupies an important place in the global economic, political and cultural reality, social life in Pakistan is characterized by great inequalities and gaps. The patriarchal system has a long tradition and has left its indelible marks on the social situation of this Asian country. Similarly, women in Pakistan are treated differently than men and most of the times, their treatment is unfair and far worse than that of men.

The position of women in Pakistani history and society has changed several times. The constitution of the Republic of Pakistan recognizes equal rights for women, giving them the right to work, vote and be educated on equal terms with men. In the 20th century, women gained the right to climb to higher social positions, such as that of the president of Pakistan, the prime minister or the speaker of the parliament. Despite these rights, however, women are daily victims of discrimination and different – often worse – treatment than men. Of course, religion has played a catalytic role in shaping women's social profile. The dominant religion in Pakistan is Islam, and its holy law, Sharia, has quite conservative positions regarding the place of women in society.

According to research by international organizations, Pakistan is ranked as the third most dangerous country in the world for a woman to live in, after Afghanistan and the Congo. Regardless of the position to which a woman belongs, women are subjected to approximately the same forms of violence: blinding with acid if they refuse a marriage, rape, etc. In some regions of the country, many women are even prosecuted for witchcraft (!), while marriages of little girls is common. That's why parents who have girls only teach them how to be good wives. Of course, if they are allowed to come to life, since abortions of girls or deaths of female infants are common in the country. There is a frequent preference for sons because they can be useful in hard farm work. Women are of course discriminated against even in matters of diet, with boys enjoying the best food. This creates health problems for women, combined with the very poor health system that exists in the Asian country anyway. Women in hospitals need different treatment than men. It is estimated that a significant number of women in Pakistan marry before the age of 18, usually to much older men chosen by their parents. Despite these sad facts about the reality, in recent years it seems that there is hope for change. Most Pakistani women go to school normally, are educated, have the right to study, vote naturally and work.

There is also the possibility of social advancement - although difficult - which can reach the highest positions, as we predicted. Real change, of course, has yet to come to the country and there is much room for improvement. Of course, this is also the big bet, for which many more efforts will be needed to achieve. A first step is being taken by international NGOs, although the respective governments of recent years do not seem to have as their first concern the improvement of women's living conditions

I explored Disneyland and the Eiffel tower. The most famous landmarks are Disneyland, the Eiffel tower and Louvre museum.

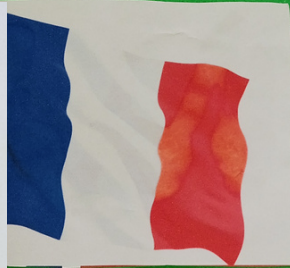
It was really amazing and exciting, I had a good time. I liked the tour around Paris so much.

Monuments

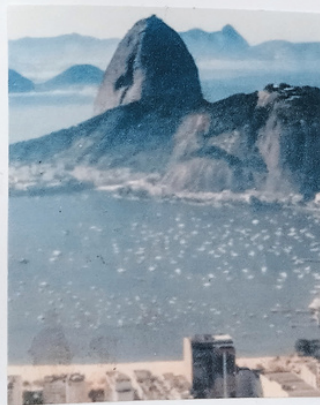
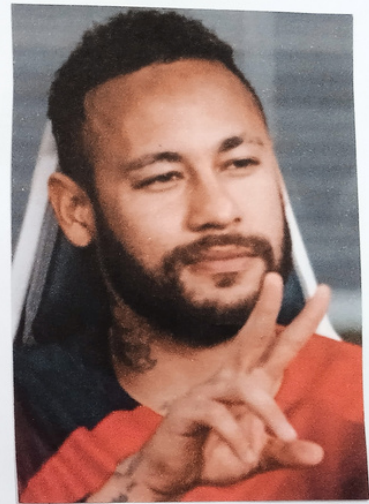

CHRISTMAS IN COUNTRIES



Christmas in Italy is as diverse as the country itself. In Italy, Christmas runs from December 8th (the Feast of the Immaculate Conception) to January 6th (the Epiphany). It's a season when Italians spend time with their families and shop at outdoor markets. Christmas in Italy isn't just folk customs and mounds of food - for many Italians, it's a pious celebration. Vatican City in Rome boasts numerous Christmas-themed religious events and attractions - including the papal midnight mass (Christmas Eve) and a giant fir tree hoisted high in St. Peter's Square. The tradition of the nativity scene comes from Italy. What is considered the first nativity scene in history (a living nativity scene) was set up by St. Francis Of Assisi in Greccio in 1223. However, nativity scenes were already found in Naples in 1025. In Italy, regional crib traditions then spread, such as that of the Bolognese crib, the Genoese crib and the Neapolitan crib. According to tradition, the Christmas Eve dinner must not contain meat. A popular dish in Naples and the South is eel or capitone. A traditional dish from Northern Italy is capon (gelded chicken), consumed especially in Piedmont and Friuli-Venezia Giulia. Lamb is more common in Central Italy. Lastly, In 1938, under fascism, the so-called "Fascist Befana" was introduced during the Christmas holidays, a demonstration for charitable purposes.
